- Move plants in pots & hanging baskets out of direct sun.
- Mow your lawn & water it well.
  Postpone feeding your lawn until you return.
- Mulch flowerbeds.
- Pack all gardening tools & outdoor furniture in a safe location.

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# SPOTLIGHT ON: POINSETTIA

A bright & cheerful poinsettia makes for the perfect Christmas table centrepiece and will last well beyond the festive season if planted in the garden in a semi-shaded area.

These are our tips for selecting & caring for your poinsettia this summer:

- Select a full and balanced-looking plant that has dark green foliage and is at least two times taller than the pot.
- Place in a position that receives at least six hours of bright, but indirect light a day.
- Only water when the soil is dry.
- Feed with a soluble house plant fertiliser once a month.
- Note that extreme temperatures or temperature changes can damage the plant and lead it to lose some of its leaves.

## DECORATING YOUR SUMMER GARDEN

Since the holiday season is all about entertaining, get your garden into the festive spirit with these creative decorations:

 Create evening ambience by adding solar lights to pathways, trees and feature plants.



 Fairy lights around patio pot plants and hanging baskets will also add sparkle to your festive season.



- Consider livening up a dull area under a tree by planting LM Berea lawn (Dactyloctenium Australe).
- Plant <u>coleus, impatiens & lavender</u> to bring colour to garden beds.





### ON YOUR TO-DO LIST FOR DECEMBER

#### Plant, Sow & Grow

- Plant <u>hanging baskets</u> with zinnia, marigolds, portulaca, alyssum, impatiens, <u>begonia</u>, coleus, <u>dahlias</u> & petunias.
- <u>Sow vegetable seeds</u> such as <u>peppers, tomatoes & carrots</u> for season-long fresh supply.
- <u>Grow herbs</u> such as <u>rosemary</u>, <u>thyme</u> &<u>chives</u> that can be incorporated into your summer cooking.

#### **Pests**

These are the common garden pests that may plague you this month, and the recommended insecticide:

- Whiteflies (use Protek Spraykill 3 or the organic Biogrow Neudosan)
- Mealybug and scale (best treated with Efekto Malasol or the organic Biogrow Bioneem)
- Lily borer (drench plants by using Protek Knox Worm)
- You can also implement <u>budget-</u> <u>friendly, organic pest busters</u> such as a spray of canola oil or catnip, or use the organic-based Ludwig's Organic Insect Spray.

#### Feed

- Feed garden beds every six weeks with seaweed-rich and organic <u>Atlantic Fertilisers Bio Ocean or</u> <u>Talborne Organics Vita Fruit & Flower</u> <u>3:1:5 (18) fertiliser.</u>
- Lawns require a 7:1:3 fertiliser such as Atlantic Bio Lawn, Talborne Vita Green 5:1:5 (16) or Wonder Lawn & Leaf. The latter is chemical-based and will provide faster results, but requires watering three times or more a week to prevent burn.
- English gardens in full bloom should be fed with a 3:1:5 fertiliser. A good option is <u>Talborne Organics Vita Fruit</u> <u>& Flower 3:1:5 (18) fertiliser</u>, Wonder Fruit & Flower or the organic-based Atlantic Fertilisers Fruit & Flower, which is endorsed by the The Federation of Rose Societies of South Africa - <u>https://roses.org.za/home/</u>.
